Our Top 5 Drought-Tolerant Shrubs to Plant this Fall

The much-anticipated rain will soon revive dry landscapes as fall settles in with its crisp air and colorful foliage. While the rain brings relief, it's worth recognizing the resilience of drought-tolerant plants that continue to thrive in even the driest conditions.

Fall is the perfect time to plant drought-tolerant shrubs in Northern California. The cooler temperatures and increased rainfall provide the ideal environment for these plants to develop strong root systems. Here are our top five drought-tolerant shrubs to plant this fall:

1. Manzanita (Arctostaphylos spp.)

- Fall planting allows its deep roots to develop before dry conditions set in. This helps it survive the following summer with minimal water.
- A native evergreen shrub with attractive red bark and small, urn-shaped flowers. It thrives in dry conditions and rocky soils.



2. California Lilac (Ceanothus)

- Ceanothus establishes well in fall, with mild weather promoting healthy root growth.
- Known for its vibrant blue flowers, Ceanothus is a hardy, attracts pollinators and requires little water once established.



3. Toyon (Heteromeles Arbutifolia)

- Planting Toyon in the fall gives it time to adapt to its environment, supporting better growth and flowering when the weather warms up.
- Sometimes called "California Holly," Toyon produces bright red berries in winter. It's a versatile, low-water shrub perfect for wildlife gardens



4. Lavender (Lavandula spp.)

- Lavender does best when planted in fall in well-drained soil, allowing roots to settle before it starts blooming in spring and summer.
- This fragrant, evergreen shrub is popular in Mediterranean gardens. It thrives in full sun and dry conditions while attracting bees and other pollinators.



5. Black and Blue Salvia (Salvia Guaranitica)

- Fall planting helps Saliva acclimate to its site, ensuring its stunning spring bloom and long-term drought tolerance.
- A favorite for attracting pollinators like hummingbirds, this salvia is easy to grow, thriving in sunny or partially shaded areas.
